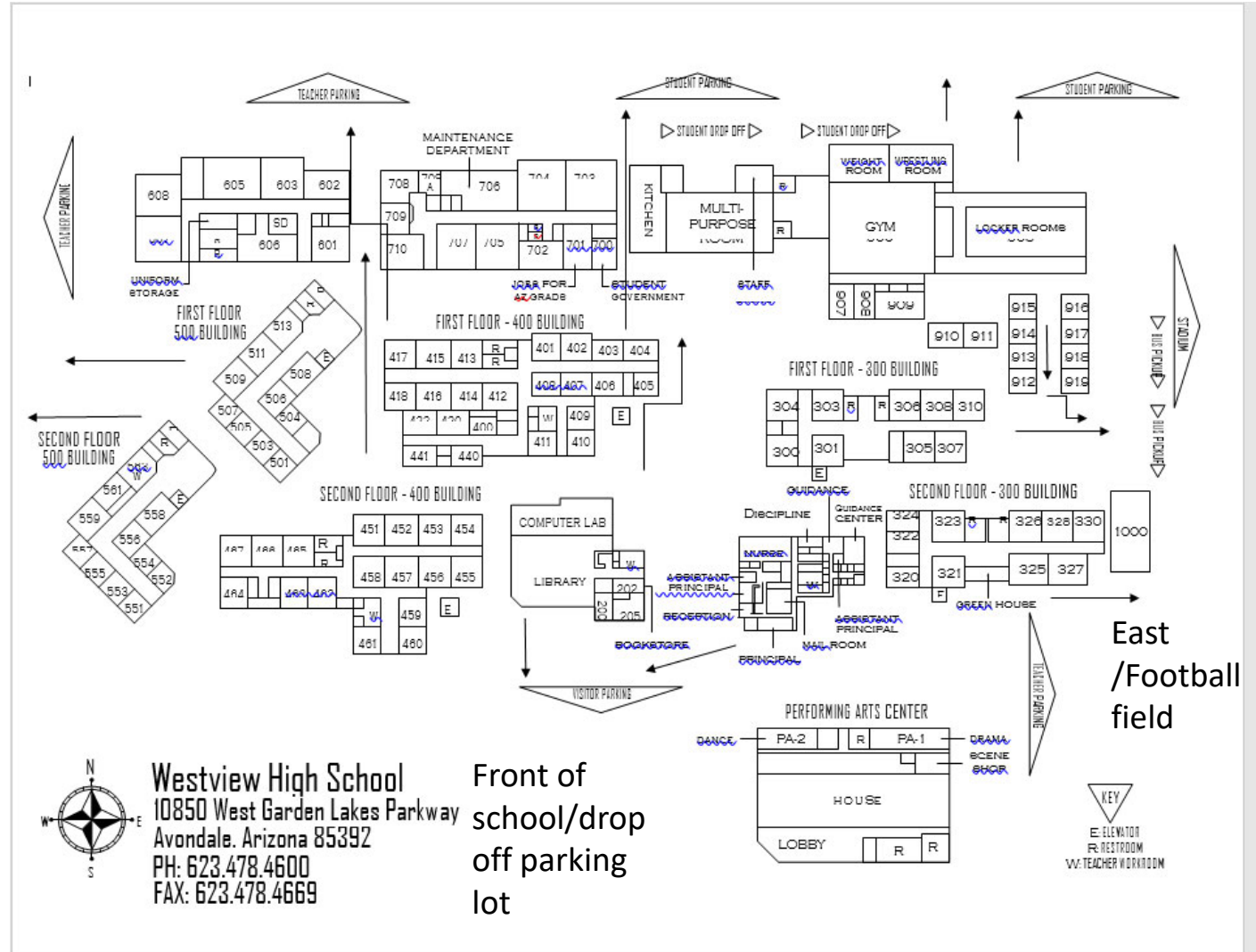

West lot, parent drop off teacher parking

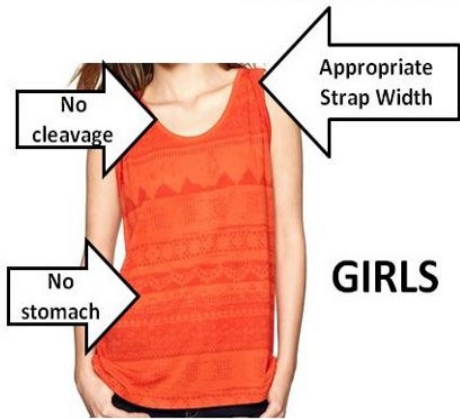
## North lot/student bus drop off/fields



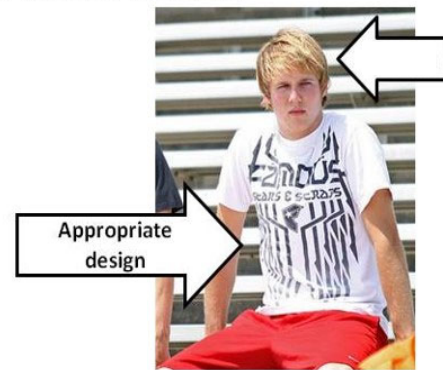

## **My name is Dr. Mosco and I will be your instructor this summer.**

I have been teaching online/blended classes at Arizona State University and Estrella Mountain Community College for 10 years. Students who do well in these classes are those that are self-motivated.

### **Students:**

You have a great opportunity here to complete your class(es) in this short 4-week time span.

If you have signed up for Economics AND Government, plan on allocating about 2 weeks to each course. You will not be able to begin the second course until you have completed the first one. If you ONLY have Economics OR Government, you can use the entire 4 weeks to complete the course.

You must come to campus at least three days a week. Understand that this is NOT enough time to complete the course(s). You will also have to work on the course(s) at home and may come to campus 5 days a week.

The first day you attend, you will create a Schedule of Unit Deadlines. To be successful, you must work diligently while at school. If you do not complete the day's work, you should complete it at home THAT DAY. You **cannot** get off track if you intend to successfully earn credit.

Unit Tests and the Final Exam need to be completed at school. You will not be able to use any additional resources (ie., Google or your phone) when you are completing these exams.

Your final grade for the course will be the exact percentage you have earned. I cannot adjust/round your final grade for the course.

Your success (or failure) depends ENTIRELY on YOU!

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**Parents:**

Students must attend class on campus at least 3 days a week. However, depending upon your student's working pace, three days a week is probably not enough time to complete course(s) successfully. If your student is enrolled in both Economics and Government, they will need to work on the course every day (even on the weekends).

The student's final grade for the course will be the exact percentage they have earned. I cannot adjust/round the final grade for the course.
